Part 7 - Abusing the TEAM Gifts

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A lack of knowledge regarding the possession of spiritual gifts and the nature of the gifts themselves. The root of all gift abuses.

A. Evolved from historical absence to modern abstinence.

2. Gift

Result of gift Ignorance, rendering the victim incapable of recognizing his or her own spiritual gifts and their influence on his or her life and ministry.

- A. May tend to build doctrine around themselves.
- B. May become "Theo-methodologists"—their methodology becomes their theology. Guilty of Bible-manipulation.
- C. May be blind to the gifts of others also.

3. Gift

The act of forcing one's spiritual gift upon others, attempting to compel them to perform as though it were God's gift to them.

- A. Tendency to think only their particular gifts really count.
- B. Involves "guilt-trip motivation"—implies others are not right with God unless they are involved with same type of ministry.
- C. Imposing works two ways:
 - 1. The burden of the heart forced on others.
 - 2. "One-stringed banjo"—same message restated repeatedly.

4. Gift

The tendency to attract and be attracted to other Christians with like spiritual gifts.

A. Homogeneous Unit—but be careful of cliques.

5. Gift

The direct and inescapable result of unrestrained Gift Gravitation.

- A. The extreme—attacks those who do not have the same gifts.
- B. Gravitation—the process; colonization—the result.
- C. Usually form a church or movement centered on that gift.

6. Gift

Desiring a gift other than the one given by the Holy Spirit.

A. Leads to frustration and lack of fulfillment.
